Governor proposes Grant program to raise beginning teacher salaries

In his State of the State address on Wed., Governor Parson proposed a grant program that would raise teacher salaries to \$38,000. Under the proposal, grants would cover 70% of the difference between the existing salary and \$38,000, and schools would make up the rest.

Hours waiver for PSRS/PEERS retirees expired in December

The temporary waiver on portions of state statues that limit the number of hours worked and salary earned by PSRS/PEERS retirees while working for covered employers in temporary, part-time and substitute positions expired December 31, 2021.

State Board of Education adopted legislative priorities

The State Board of Education recently outlined new legislative priorities for the 2022 legislative session. These priorities focus on five areas: educator recruitment and retention, safe and healthy schools, success-ready students and workforce development, early learning and early literacy, and providing access to opportunity.
